



BURNING STAR STATE FISH AND WILDLIFE AREA – SHOP LAKE

2017 FISHERIES FACT SHEET

LOCATION: Shop Lake is accessed from State Route 149 in Jackson County. From 149 turn north onto Mine Road to the south parking lot for the Burning Star complex which is located between DeSoto and Hurst.

DESCRIPTION: There are no facilities or boat ramps at this 24 acre lake. All fishing is walk-in only and no motorized boats are allowed.

STATUS OF THE SPORT FISHERY – The following is a brief summary of the major sport fish species based on annual fish population surveys conducted by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

Largemouth Bass (LMB) – Thirty-one LMB (4-17 inches) were collected in the 2016 fall electrofishing survey. Prior to its opening to the public in April 2016, it appears this lake had a bass crowded population which is beginning to be reduced by angler harvest. As more of the smaller bass below the 14-18 protected slot limit are harvested, the remaining smaller bass will grow into the protected slot limit. Once in the protected slot limit, the growth rates of the bass should increase leading to an increase in the number larger bass in the lake in the next 3-5 years.

Crappie – No crappie were collected in the 2016 survey.

Bluegill Sunfish – The bluegill population is poor. No bluegill over 7 inches were collected in the 2016 survey.

Redear Sunfish – No redear sunfish were collected in the 2016 survey.

Channel Catfish – No catfish were collected during the 2016 survey.

RECREATIONAL USE RESTRICTIONS – From November 1 through the end of February fishing is prohibited. No vehicular access is allowed past the gates. No motorized boats allowed.
